

Cobweb Cover - Free Crochet Pattern (UK terminology)

Materials

 8×50 g Patons fairytale 4 ply acrylic baby yarn or any 4 ply baby yarn.

2.50 mm hook

Finished size

115 cm x 90 cm (45" x 35")

Tension

19 trebles and 16 rows = 10 cm \times 10 cm (4" \times 4") over pattern.

Abbreviations

dc double-crochet

times. (111 chain-spaces)

Foundation chain Chain 225 loosely. (Tip: use a larger size hook to work the foundation chain.)

1st row 1 treble in 4th chain from hook. 1 treble in each chain to end. (223 stitches) **Row A** Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Turn. 1 dc in same stitch. (Chain 3. Skip next treble. 1 dc in next stitch.) 111

Row B Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Turn. 1 dc in next chain-space. (Chain 3. Skip next dc. 1 dc in next chain-space.) 110 times. Chain 1. 1 treble in last dc.

Row C Chain 3 (counts as 1 treble). Turn. 1 treble in same chain-space. (Skip next dc. 2 trebles in next chain-space) 110 times. 1 treble in last dc. (223 stitches)
Row D Chain 3 (counts as 1 treble). Turn. 1 treble in each stitch to end.

Note

This project is worked in 4-ply yarn which gives it a lighter and more lacy texture than can be achieved with thicker double-knitting. Acrylic yarn has been used, although any baby yarn will do.

The cover is reversible, so either side can be the right side.

Row E Repeat row A.

Row F Chain 2. (counts as a chain-space). Turn. 1 dc in next chain-space. (Chain 3. Skip next dc. 1 dc in next chain-space.) 110 times. 1 treble in last dc.

Row G Chain 3 (counts as 1 treble). Turn. (Skip next dc. 2 trebles in next chainspace) 111 times. (223 stitches)

Row H Repeat row D.

Rows 10 - 137 Repeat rows A-H 16 times (or as many times as desired). Do not fasten off after final row, but turn work a quarter-turn (left-handers turn work anticlockwise, right-handers turn work clockwise) and commence edging.

Edging

Work an edging of (chain 3. 1 dc) repeated along the edges of the cover. (Use symbol chart as guide to placing dcs.)

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
